## Crocheted mini elves' hats for wooden mice

Crochet these small elves' hats from cotton yarn for wooden mice as cosy Christmas decorations. You will need 1 red and 1 white ball of cotton yarn and No. 3 crochet hook.

## Small hat

Chain 5 ch from red yarn. Finish each row with a ch (turning chain)

1: crochet 4 dc - start in the 2nd ch from the

hook.

2-5: 1 dc **(4)** 

6: increase with 1 dc in both sides **(6)** 

7-12: 1 dc **(6)** 

13: increase with 1 dc in both sides (8)

14-15: 1 dc **(8)** 

16: increase with 2 dc in both sides (12)

17-19: 1 dc (12)

20: increase with 2 dc in both sides (16)

21-22: 1 dc **(16)** 

23: increase with 2 dc in both sides (20)

24: 1 dc **(20)** 

25: increase with 2 dc in both sides (24)

26: 1 dc **(24)** 

Change to white cotton yarn

27: 1 dc **(24)** 

Cut the yarn, pull the end of the yarn through the loop, tighten and secure the end.

Large hat

Chain 5 ch from red yarn. Finish each row with a ch (turning chain)

1: crochet 4 dc - start in the 2nd ch from the

hook.

2-10: 1 dc **(4)** 

11: increase with 1 dc in both sides **(6)** 

12-17: 1 dc **(6)** 

18: increase with 1 dc in both sides (8)19: increase with 2 dc in both sides (12)

20: 1 dc **(12)** 



21: increase with 2 dc in both sides (16)

22-23: 1 dc **(16)** 

24: increase with 2 dc in both sides (20)

25: 1 dc **(20)** 

26: increase with 2 dc in both sides (24)

27: 1 dc **(24)** 

28: increase with 2 dc in both sides **(28)**29: increase with 2 dc in both sides **(32)** 

30-31: 1 dc **(32)** 

32: increase with 2 dc in both sides (36)

33: 1 dc **(36)** 

34: increase with 1 dc in both sides (38)

35: 1 dc **(38)** 

Change to white cotton yarn

36: 1 dc **(38)** 

Cut the yarn, pull the end of the yarn through the loop, tighten and secure the end.



Sew the hats together in the middle at the back. Make a white tassel using a fork. Tie the tassel onto the cotton yarn at the top of the hat.




