Yarn requirements: 15 g cotton yarn 4/8 and 1 hair band with a diameter of 4.5 cm

Crochet hook no. 3

Tip: You can keep track of your progress by changing to a new colour each time you start a new round. You can also choose one colour for all 4 rounds. Finish the work with a contrasting colour for the edge/round 5.

Abbreviations and symbol explanations

dc	=	double crochet
ch	=	chain stitch
tr	=	treble crochet
sl st	=	slip stitch
st	=	stitch

1. **Round 1:** attach the yarn around the hair band with a diameter of 4.5 cm. Crochet dc around the elastic all the way around. A total of 65 dc is preferable (the more dc you make, the 'wavier' the scrunchie will be). End the round with a sl st in the first dc.

Important! Make sure that the stitches do not twist around the elastic band and that they are all on the outside.

2. **Round 2:** start with 3 ch (counts as first tr). Now crochet 2 tr in the same stitch as the sl st in the previous round. Crochet 3 tr in each st all the way around. End the round with 1 sl st in the third ch you made at the start of the round.
3. **Round 3:** start with 1 ch. Now crochet 1 tr in the same st as you made the sl st in the last round. Crochet 1 tr in every stitch all the way around. End the round with a sl st in the first ch you made at the start of the round.
4. **Round 4:** start with 1 ch. Now crochet 1 tr in the same st as you made the sl st in the last round. Crochet 1 tr in every stitch all the way around. End the round with a sl st in the first ch you made at the start of the round. Cut the yarn and fasten off .
5. **Edge/round 5:** attach the yarn somewhere along the edge of your scrunchie with a dc. Crochet 2 dc in each st all the way around. Finish the round with a sl st in the first dc. Cut the yarn and fasten off the ends.
